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From NOT a Manchurian Candidate, BUT....

And this seems to be what the Republican Party wants for America. Or are they just doing the thing they always do: walking around with their heads in the air, oblivious to everything except their raging Id.

It's the main reason why they can't govern; they are all about the getting of it and know nothing beyond what will serve them personally; not foreign affairs, not domestic affairs, not the economy, nothing, and they've been this way for a very long time.
